FAQS:

WHERE WILL I HAVE CLASS IN FIRST YEAR?

- Most of your course load will be made up of Commerce-specific classes that are held in Goodes Hall (located on Union Street between Frontenac Street and Alfred Street)
- You will have two outside electives first year and these classes and tutorials for this class will depend on which course you pick, but all the information you need will be on Solus.

WHAT RESIDENCE IS THE BEST?

This is one of the most common questions students ask, and the answer will vary from person to person. It all comes down to your preferences and the university experience you want. Whether you want a communal-style residence for the social aspect or you would prefer a suite-style building for privacy, each residence comes with its benefits.

If you get placed into a university residence you think you won't like, don't panic. Plenty of students don't get one of their top choices. Every student ends up making the best of the opportunities their residence has to offer, and the bonds shared with those on your residence floor will stay with you throughout your years at Queen's University. We advise you to keep an open mind and take advantage of new experiences.

Living off-campus is also a great option. Off-campus life gives students more flexibility and freedom, and Queen's student neighbourhood means that you are often just a 5 minute walk from campus and your peers.







WHAT ORGANIZATIONS CAN STUDENTS JOIN IN FIRST YEAR?

Queen's is home to plenty of student clubs and organizations, and the Smith School of Business has its own clubs under the Commerce Society. Most clubs have positions for First Year Representative that they hire for in September, so be on the lookout for applications. There are very few First Year Representative positions at Queen's, so do not get discouraged if you don't get one in September. Clubs will have larger hiring cycles in the Winter term for the next school year.

- Leadership positions in student residences
- Club-organized social events

HOW CAN I LEARN ABOUT CLUBS IN COMMERCE AND AT QUEEN'S?

Most clubs will have information nights early on in the year. These are a great chance to hear from club executives about the subject and work the club focuses on. Clubs will also often host guest speaker and workshop events open to the public to give everyone a chance to learn. Quite often, AMS and Commerce clubs with a similar industry or interest area will partner to host events, giving you a 2-for-1 learning opportunity.

One of the best ways to learn about clubs is by having coffee chats with students doing clubs and activities you're interested in. If you've never coffee chatted anyone before or aren't sure how to go about doing so, send a direct message or email to the HSL executive! Upper year students understand how overwhelming the activities and club scene at Queen's can be for new First Years, so we'll do everything we can to help. We'd be happy to have a coffee chat with you and answer questions you have about Commerce and Queen's, or direct you towards the right person to coffee chat for specific clubs and interests.
